

JOHN V. SMITH

Dies at Midnight of Dropsy of the Heart

In His Eighty-Second Year--The Remains to Be Taken to Win- chester for Burial.

John Vanderpool Smith died at 12:45 last night at the residence of his son, John R. Smith, on South Spring street.

Mr. Smith was in his eighty-second year, and the immediate cause of his death was dropsy of the heart. He was born in Lewistown, Penn., Nov. 27, 1815. He came to Kentucky when about 21 years of age. He was twice married, his first wife being a daughter of Judge James Payne Mitchell, of Boyle county, and his second Miss Elizabeth R. Owsley, of Winchester, both of whom preceded him to the grave. He leaves four children, Jaa. M. Smith, of Richmond, Ky.; W. W. Smith, news editor of the Kentucky Stock Farm; J. R. Smith, the real estate man, and one daughter, Miss Nannie Smith, who reside in Lexington. He was a member of the Maxwell street Presbyterian Church. His remains will be taken to Winchester for burial. No arrangements have yet been made for the funeral.
